ABOUT THIS CATALOG

Dance-Video Canada is the work of video artist/videographer Matthew Speier. All the tapes in the catalog were made by him with the support of a Canada Council Explorations Grant. They reflect & represent only the unique point of view exercised with his camera & do not purport to be objective documents of the choreographer's art. Rather, the tapes should be viewed as one artist's version of another artist's work. The keu word in this interpretive process is translation. The camera is a framing device. Every frame is a decision to include some picture elements & to leave some out. How the camera moves to put the elements together while the dancer moves about in real space will determine the impact & success of the translation. How the cameraman interviews from behind his camera will determine how successfully he translates the personality on the other side of it.

ABOUT THE TAPES

The tapes are not finished video productions with titles & commentary. They contain good quality camera-edited b&w footage of dancers at work (not public performances) & show the creative & technical process of dance. They are very suitable for dance instructors, students & educators, as well as visual artists

& media specialists interested in dance & body movement. They show: dancers rehearsing, doing warm-up exercises, taking classes & improvising; instructors teaching & correcting; choreographies in progress; & interviews. Professional companies, workshop groups, university groups & local dance schools expose the viewer to a wide range of dance experience in the contemporary Canadian scene.


