Twenty-five male student volunteers were arbitrarily divided into two groups. Within the confines of a simulated prison block, the students assumed the roles of either prisoners or prison guards. The experiment had to be called off after only six days because the students could no longer make the distinction between role playing and reality.

Ivan Horvat, chair of the Inmate Committee who was later murdered at Archambault, Quebec on December 9, 1979, talks about "forced transfer" procedures.
