

"Who Killed Target 1967?" Is a sci-fi requiem for Jean-Luc Godard's star actress and muse, Anna Karina. Drawing on the myths of Frankenstein and Narcissus, the film sets out to deconstruct contemporary cinema's voyeuristic obsession with female beauty. A vengeful female scientist, outraged by Godard's victimization of Anna Karina, constructs a beautiful female robot to seduce and destroy lovers attracted solely by physical beauty. Conflict arises when the robot begins to outgrow her creator's intentions.

Angie Kwong was born in Hong Kong and currently lives and works in Vancouver. She received her BFA from Emily Carr Institute of Art and Design (Vancouver) in 2004. Her graduation film "Who Killed Target 1967?" has been exhibited locally and internationally. It received the Best Experimental Short Film Award in the 5th Melbourne Underground Film Festival as well as Best Directing and Best Film Awards in the 18th Annual National S t u d e n t F i, I m a n d V i d e o F e s t i v a l (S a s k a t c h e w a n).






Don Simmons & Ken Buera

Filliou says it happened when someone dropped a dry sponge into a bucket of water. On Saturday, January 17th, 2004, Calgary based laptop group EMMAX produced this song in honour of Art's birthday, at the New Gallery in Calgary, Alberta. Utilizing live conversations in the gallery, phone messages, and streamed audio from the internet, EMMAX remixed the ambience of local celebration.

Don Simmons is a conceptual artist based in Calgary, Alberta. Recently, he completed his MFA degree at the Nova Scotia College of Art and Design in Fine and Media Arts. In the past, he studied art history in Italy while completing his diploma in Drawing and Painting at the Ontario College of Art and Design. Simmons has participated in exhibitions across Canada and the US, with forthcoming exhibitions at the Walter Phillips Gallery (Banff) curated by Jim Drobnick, the Western Front (Vancouver) curated by Victoria Singh & Velveeta Krisp, as well as the Truck Gallery and EMMEDIA in Calgary. Simmons' work usually takes the form of robotics, electronics, audio, installation or performance. He is currently on faculty at the Alberta College of Art and Design in their Media Arts and Digital Technologies Department.







Singing Dissected Laser Printer Disc 3

LEE HUTZULAK PETER LE SINGING THE DISSECTED LASER PRINTER

Lee Hutzulak

(Live) (20:00) Vancouver BC

A broken office laser printer is carefully dissected into its hundreds of component pieces. Using only these pieces, a work surface and a recording studio, the dissected printer is bowed, rolled, knocked, shuffled, rattled, etc. Over 2 hours of recorded raw performance are meticulously edited, separated into individual events and burned as 3 CDs, each comprised of 99 tracks. The tracks range in length from 4 seconds (single knocks / taps / thumps) to 3 minutes (rattling / scraping / bowing). The selected events from these 297 individual pieces are then placed into a 16 track mixer / hard disc recorder on a timeline forming an approximate but flexible composition. In addition, the prepared CDs are accessed and manipulated in portable CD players. Although a few external electronics are also utilized to extend the sounds, the main focus is on the pure unprocessed tones coaxed from the printer parts themselves. To this end, a number of the actual printer parts are "played" acoustically in the performance. With a nimble touch the resulting music is rich in tone and texture, from ranging a last gasp death rattle to a purgatory of sustained monotony, from a sonorous piece to a miniature factory in full production.






Kai Ling Xue

Daniel Barrow

(2:52) Winnipeg, MB

Since 1993, Daniel Barrow has used an overhead projector to relay ideas and short narratives. Specifically, he creates and adapts comic book narratives to a "manual" form of animation by projecting, layering and manipulating drawings on Mylar transparencies. "A Miracle" is a music video created for Toronto-based "gay church folk" musicians, The Hidden Cameras, that documents Barrow's performance methods. The story of the video features a young boy lying in bed, using the light of the moon to make shadow puppets on his bedroom walls. While experimenting with forms, he summons the spirit of a huge fruity, bird-like creature with the silhouette of an owl, and the feathers of an ostrich. The creature has a brief, sensual exchange with the boy before swallowing him whole and then regurgitating, twisting and compressing him into a gizzard-shaped ball.

Daniel Barrow is a media artist living in Winnipeg. He exhibits widely in Canada and abroad. Much of Daniel's work aims to collide the popular imagery from childhood and prepubescent adolescence with residual feelings of backwardness, innocence, joy, shame and separation. In doing so he attempts a return to a former and less complexes complexes a return to a


Dirk Adams

In much of my audio work, the merging of physical and auditory experience remains one of my central areas of fascination. In multi-channel and installation work, I explore the possibilities of spatializing sound to activate the architecture of the exhibition space. Through sound walks, I aim to create a very personal relationship for the solitary listener wherein a heightened awareness of his or her surroundings is evoked by the content of the audio score.

"Mortalmanifest" Oren Ben Yosef

Imposing fear, Wake, as its name suggests, is a 53 minute ceremonial audio work that follows ten stages of its bleak funeral, from gathering to scattering. The music itself, besides the ceremonial repeating bells, is not really music, only the traces of one long forgotten tune.

Oren is also known as Mortalmanifest, an act that started its way from harsh industrial beats and found the path of scorched and ceremonial ambience. MortalManifest creates bleak sounds and textures that feel the places where music once was.




Brandon Blommaert

Brandon Blommaert is a Calgary based artist. His field of interest shifts from animation, printmaking, drawing, and sound design, etc.







Quienes Son? (Who are they?)




(08:07) New York, USA

In October 1962, the world was at a standstill. In response to the failed invasion of Cuba by the United States, the Soviet Union began a buildup of offensive missiles on the island. The United States, in turn, imposed a blockade on Cuba and demanded that the Soviets dismantle their arms. After two tense weeks, the Soviets finally agreed, and in exchange, the Americans promised to never invade. This promise, however, never fully allayed Cuban fears of an attack... "Quienes Son?" is an experimental short film that combines elements of documentary with fantasy to portray a surreal vision of Cuba. "Quienes Son?" uses an "extraterrestrial" metaphor to look at the testimonials regarding the appearance of "extraterrestrials" in the island. These sequences are woven together with the perspectives of the interviewer, and by the implied presence of the roaming intruder. Adding to the mixture are excerpts from Cuban radio that denounce the cultural and economical dominance of the United States, and a mysterious and spacey original score. While many films either romanticize Cuba's system, or critique the current regime, "Quienes Son?" aims to look at the lighter side of Cuba's fear of an invasion. Who are the aliens? Are they coming from outer space of Cape Canaveral? Today, Cuba is in a surreal zone, caught between the remnants of socialism and the harsh competitive reality of capitalism. Ever since the demise of the eastern bloc, Cuba has gone to great lengths to continue adhering to its ideology while being forced to concede some reforms. The ensuing economic and social "invasion" has and will continue to cast profound changes as the country eventually clashes with its post-Castro future. "Quienes Son?" is the first film in a series that will take unconventional views of an ever-more globalized world.

Alexander Stikich (filmmaker and photographer) grew up bouncing between Venezuela and Yugoslavia to eventually end up in New York. His work has been screened/exhibited worldwide in numerous festivals and venues including Sundance, the Worldwide Video Festival and The Brooklyn Museum of Art. Currently, he is working on various projects incorporating issues such as globalization, human rights, immigration and corruption. Alex is interested in combining elements of documentary together with a surreal overlay to create spontaneous and inspiring imagery.

Mollusc




Natalie Rich-Fernandez

(03:46) France

There is no story told, it is generated by the accumulation of images, the work is one about the conscious, the subconscious, the animal side within us, the energies. In this video-film, I attribute the role of "Mollusc" to my mouth, allowing it to savour the delights of such liquids as milk, grenadine and mint. Instantly, it absorbs, spits out, and blows; the tongue jets out and licks the coloured substance. The world is an amalgam of underwater, sensual, sexual, aesthetic animal and vegetable. I go into great detail, in somewhat of an exhibitionist manner, displaying a very intimate part of the body: the lips, the tongue, the wrinkles, the hair and the skin forming part of the framework, all of which, bathed in an elegant coloured substance, suggests the humid and aquatic nature of the mollusc. The sound-track of the film is focused on the movements of the lips, on its internal and personal murmurs, and the sounds of the delicate and subtle little bubbles. The mouth comprises a cavity which forms the initial segment of the digestive tube. The tongue is an elongated, fleshy and mobile entity located in this cavity. The saliva is a clear and flowing liquid secreted by the salivary glands, and the mollusc is an aquatic invertebrate or a humid composition of a soft and spineless body. The three principal partners are the snail, the octopus, and the mussel.

Natalie Rich-Fernandez has been painting for a long time and she tackles video as one does in painting, it seems like a performance where she dresses all the elements which compose and create an image.




Jowita Kepa




Shaan Syed


Stephanie Loveless




Per Samuelsson




the marble factory: tom elliott and angela somerset

We began this project shortly after reading of a factory that produced one million marbles each day while operated by only two workers. The idea of a marble factory became, for us, the idea of a continual possibility for making things - always transforming; both machines and their operators. We interact with material objects and processes, recording mechanical gestures with found and altered objects as a way of imagining the machines, considering how they are constructed, for what purpose, and how they behave. For public presentation we are interested in how our sounds and images might simultaneously alter and take on the physical and social resonance of their environment. This offers us the opportunity to respond to the characteristics of various sites and to re-imagine the use of these spaces as temporary marble factories.

Tom Elliott and Angela Somerset are interdisciplinary artists living in Winnipeg, Manitoba. They have been collaborating on artistic and curatorial projects, artistrun centre publications, etc., on and off for about 9 years. 




Graeme Patterson




